

SYNOPSIS

The Game of Chaos is an intense and captivating documentary that delves into the ingenuity and resilience of small nations navigating the chaos created by global powers. The film explores how countries like Finland and Estonia respond to constant uncertainty and turmoil by leveraging technology, international collaboration, and bold innovation. Chaos manifests through hybrid threats, disinformation campaigns, and cyberattacks aimed at undermining democratic institutions and destabilizing societies.

Eastern Finland focuses on developing digital border security and seeks solutions to ongoing challenges through partnerships with startups. The documentary features experts and technology developers from Finland, Estonia, and the United Kingdom, offering fresh perspectives on cybersecurity and the role of AI in modern conflict.

Estonian cybersecurity expert Anett Numa succinctly captures the strategy of small nations: "We will never win by strength, but we can win by intelligence. The key lies in speed, collaboration, and using technology in ways larger nations do not expect." NATO DIANA Innovation Lab leader Kadri Tammai emphasizes: "Innovation is the secret weapon of small nations. We need to think agilely and boldly because cyber threats won't wait."

At the heart of the film is a poignant story of Jaanika Merilo's work using AI to trace Ukrainian children forcibly relocated to Russia and reunite them with their families. As Jaanika states: "This work is not just about technology – it's about hope for those who have lost everything."

The film also features Finnish experts such as Saara Jantunen and Heidi Ruotsalainen, who shed light on the realities of hybrid and cyber threats and the military and ethical challenges of the future. Contributions from British startup developers add an international perspective and innovative approaches that challenge traditional notions of warfare.

The Game of Chaos provides a realistic look at how nations survive and respond to the challenges posed by global powers. The documentary demonstrates that small nations can not only defend themselves but also shape the future battlefield.

BACKDROP

Innovation in the Midst of Chaos. Finland and Estonia, small Baltic nations sharing a border with Russia, have a long history of balancing their independence against the backdrop of a superpower that thrives on creating and exploiting chaos. This chaos manifests in hybrid threats, disinformation campaigns, and cyberattacks aimed at destabilizing societies and weakening democratic institutions. For centuries, both nations have adapted to survive under the shadow of Russia's geopolitical ambitions.

Finland, known for its historical neutrality, and Estonia, fiercely pro-Western since regaining independence in 1991, have experienced seismic shifts in their security landscapes. Russia's annexation of Crimea in 2014 was a wake-up call, but the full-scale invasion of Ukraine in 2022 redefined the region's political and military dynamics. Finland formally ended its military non-alignment by joining NATO, standing alongside Estonia, a long-standing member.

In this volatile reality, both countries are leveraging their expertise in digital innovation, artificial intelligence, and cybersecurity to navigate the challenges of living next to an unpredictable neighbor. These small nations are turning vulnerability into strength, developing cutting-edge solutions to counter disinformation and protect their borders from hybrid warfare.

Women leaders in AI and cybersecurity are playing a critical role in this transformation, demonstrating how resilience and innovation can empower even the smallest nations to thrive in an era of chaos. Their work not only ensures their countries' safety but also redefines the possibilities for modern defense and international collaboration.


ANETT


DIRECTOR'S NOTE
