To All delegations of the OSCE Parliamentary Assembly,

Dear Colleagues,

It is regrettable that certain delegates of the OSCE Parliamentary Assembly persist in undermining its institutional character by departing from the core values and principles upon which it was established. Having read Mr. Joe Wilson's recent post on X, enclosed herewith (see Annex 1), we were struck by the extent of hate speech and derogatory language it contains, exceptional even for a figure as controversial as him.

Moving beyond baseless allegations and unsubstantiated claims, Mr. Wilson proceeds to make explicit threats and defamatory statements directed at the participating state of the OSCE. The accusations presented in his statement are utterly absurd and devoid of factual basis, suggesting that the author is driven by personal gain rather than objective reasoning. Such act is wholly unacceptable and constitutes an affront not only to Georgia but to the dignity and credibility of the OSCE itself. Thus, we urge the Bureau of the OSCE Parliamentary Assembly to condemn Mr. Wilson's statements as contradictory to the fundamental values, norms and standards of conduct upheld by the OSCE.

It is further alarming that the OSCE Parliamentary Assembly has adopted a proposal advanced by an individual capable of resorting to such deplorable act. We express our strong objection to the inclusion of unfounded references derived from a resolution sponsored by Mr. Wilson in the final draft of the Hague Declaration, and underscore that this represents a deliberate distortion of reality - turning a blind eye to the documented acts of violence committed by groups of individuals against the constitutional bodies of the country - the Parliament Building and the Presidential Palace, and going as far as blatantly twisting the core message of the Final Report of the ODIHR Election Observation Mission, as well as that of Preliminary Findings and Conclusions presented by the OSCE PA, ODIHR, PACE, NATO PA and EU Parliament in October 2024.

In light of the foregoing, we request the Bureau of the OSCE Parliamentary Assembly to devote one of its upcoming sessions to the aforementioned matters, particularly the content of the Hague Declaration concerning Georgia, with the Head of the Georgian delegation invited to present our position and provide appropriate clarifications.
