On April 22-24, 2026, the International Congress Centre in Katowice is hosting the 18th edition of the European Economic Congress.

A three days long debate, held annually in Katowice, the centre of Poland's Silesia region, the EEC is among Europe's key economic events, a statement corroborated by the rank of its participants. The value of debate and conclusions of the European Economic Congress is a product of the competence of our guests, their openness to different opinions, willingness to engage in dialogue, and their courage to address difficult subjects.

We wish to invite you to participate in the European Economic Congress scheduled for April 22-24, 2026, in the character of Special Guest.

We shall await your response, hoping to meet you in Katowice, the heart of Silesia. We remain open to your suggestions on the subject and form of your participation in the European Economic Congress. We also offer our support in organizing your stay in Poland.
