Life Science: A Catalyst for European Competitiveness
October 8-9 2025

The life science sector is one of Europe's key strengths and a cornerstone of our societies, delivering better health for citizens, economic productivity and growth, as well as medicine security. Yet, the EU faces two pressing challenges that threaten its long-term ability to improve patient care: European competitiveness is waning as the private sector struggles to keep pace with global rivals in the race for innovation and investment. Meanwhile, wide gaps persist across member states, both in the sector's economic contribution to society and in the access to innovative medicines. Enhancing European competitiveness and spreading its gains across the Union are essential to building stronger health systems for the benefit of patients and practitioners alike.

Investing in health enhances economic productivity, reduces healthcare costs, and fosters social equity by ensuring access to care and improving overall well-being. It also strengthens societal resilience, drives innovation through public-private collaborations, and supports long-term sustainability in health systems.

On October 8, Healthcare Denmark will host a reception at the Copenhagen City Hall.

On October 9, the *Copenhagen Life Science Summit - Life Science: A Catalyst for European Competitiveness* will explore how Europe can reclaim its leadership in life sciences while aligning public and private goals to ensure that the benefits of competitiveness are widely shared. The conference will focus on how forthcoming initiatives under the EU's *Competitiveness Compass* can drive progress across five horizontal enablers: lowering barriers to the single market; expanding access to investment; fostering skills, quality jobs and social fairness; simplifying regulation; and improving policy coordination across member states.

Discussions will center on how to unlock Europe's potential by making sure that strategic investment in health and stronger public-private partnerships can enhance economic productivity, reduce healthcare costs, and build social resilience and equity by ensuring access to care and improving overall well-being.
