A Tabletop Exercise on Diplomatic Responses to a Regional AI-Enabled Incident

On the sidelines of the UN Global Dialogue on AI Governance

On behalf of Chatham House and AI Safety Asia, co-hosted by Université de Genève, it is our pleasure to invite you to a tabletop exercise on diplomatic responses to an AI-enabled incident highlighting regional coordination, held on the sidelines of the inaugural UN Global Dialogue on AI Governance.

This deliberative roundtable simulates a fictional-but-feasible scenario: an AI-enabled disruption to global shipping and trade. Guided by facilitators, participants work in regional groups to explore response options to an unpredictable, escalating and interdependent event.

The exercise focuses on two regions: (1) Asia-Pacific via ASEAN and (2) the North Atlantic via EU, UK and Canada. It will generate a set of practical recommendations for strengthening regional diplomacy during future incidents. These findings will be platformed at the Swiss AI Summit and the next Global Dialogue, and form part of a broader programme of work on global governance readiness.

No background knowledge is required. This is an exploratory, open-ended exercise, strictly convened under the Chatham House Rule.
