The State of Europe high-level roundtable 2024 will focus on deliberating the choices Europe must make to deliver the governance its citizens need in an increasingly challenging environment that includes the Ukraine war, intensifying great-power competition, and a deteriorating climate-social crisis.

We involve sitting and former (prime) ministers, CEOs, NGO leaders, top European officials, members of parliaments, influencers, top journalists, and European Young Leaders, in an interactive and inclusive brainstorm – a new way of working to generate new ideas for a new era. Discussions at the roundtable will be supported and informed by citizen perspectives gathered by way of focus groups led by Debating Europe, Friends of Europe's citizen engagement unit.

On 6 November, the eve of the roundtable, you are also warmly invited to attend the President's Gala Dinner. This intimate evening offers our high-level guests an informal, yet intellectually stimulating and entertaining opportunity to connect ahead of the next day's debates.
