On December 8, 2023, the International Olympic Committee took a decision on admission of the athletes with Russian and Belarusian passports to the Olympic Games 2024 based on strict eligibility conditions. The strict eligibility conditions for Individual Neutral Athletes at Paris 2024 are the very same strict eligibility conditions under which were set such athletes to be qualified, including the condition that "athletes who are contracted to the Russian or Belarusian military or national security agencies will not be eligible to be entered or to compete. Support personnel who are contracted to the Russian or Belarusian military or national security agencies will not be entered."

Anastasiya Shkurdai (Анастасія Шукрдай), a Belarusian swimmer, has qualified to the Olympic Games in Paris 2024. At the same time, there is a ground to believe that Ms Shkurdai has affiliation with the Belarus military, in particular with the Armed Forces. In the light of the above, it is kindly requested to review the case of qualifications of Anastasiya Shkurdai to the Olympic Games 2024 and her commitment to the strict eligibility conditions.


