

## Summary of the proposed amendment

Estonia proposes a standard programme amendment of the Internal Security Fund (ISF) programme for the additional allocation from the Mid-Term Review.

The proposed amendment contributes mainly to the achievement of the ISF specific objective 1 “Exchange of information” and in minor part to the achievement of the ISF specific objective 3 “Preventing and combating crime” of Regulation (EU) 2021/1149 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 7 July 2021 establishing the Internal Security Fund. All proposed amendments are in line with the enabling conditions and horizontal principles referred to in Regulation (EU) 2021/1060.

A version of the programme with tracked changes is enclosed for transparency.

Proposed amendment has been approved by the Monitoring Committee on 13.08.2025 (Protocol No 14-13.2/109-1; signed on 15.08.2025)

Relevant adjustments have been made in the background information, the narrative part of the programme as well as in the financing and indicators tables.

The additional Mid-Term Review allocation will be used to:

- 1) tackle Scheval recommendation No 102 “Introduce an automated data loader to the Europol Information System and ensure that criminal information obtained within ongoing investigations is uploaded when it relates to serious and organised crime and terrorism” under specific objective 1;
- 2) enhance Prüm II (Regulation (EU) 2024/982 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 13 March 2024 on the automated search and exchange of data for police cooperation) data exchange capacity under specific objective 1;
- 3) implement the API Regulation (Regulation (EU) 2025/13 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 19 December 2024 on the collection and transfer of advance passenger information for the prevention, detection, investigation and prosecution of terrorist offences and serious crime) and improve the Passenger Name Record system under specific objective 1;
- 4) enhance CBRN (chemical, biological, radiological and nuclear) trainings under specific objective 3.

The output and result indicators have been adjusted due to the additional above-mentioned activities and due to changes in indicator methodology. The latter includes mainly the output indicator “Number of items of equipment purchased”, which includes now only the equipment to which an inventory number is assigned and the output indicator “Number of participants in training activities”, where only the officials trained are counted. Relevant result indicators have been adjusted accordingly.

In addition, references to legislation, policy strategies, web links and relevant stakeholders updated in the table 9 of the horizontal enabling conditions.
