Job title:	European Delegated Prosecutor ¹

Place of employment:	In the Member State of nomination, and dependent on the functional and territorial division of competences in that Member State

Role

The European Delegated Prosecutors ("EDPs") are an integral part of the EPPO and, when investigating and prosecuting offences within the competence of the EPPO, they act exclusively on behalf and in the name of the EPPO on the territory of their respective Member State.

The EDPs carry out their tasks as the decentralised level of the EPPO structure, under supervision of the EP and the monitoring of the Permanent Chambers, in compliance with the EPPO Regulation, the Internal Rules of Procedure of the EPPO, the Conditions of employment of the EDPs, as well as relevant guidelines and the ethical framework.

In this framework, the European Delegated Prosecutor's role is to carry out the investigations at national level, to prosecute and bring to judgement before the national courts crimes affecting the financial interests of the EU, fulfilling the reporting obligation to the Permanent Chambers and cooperating with other EDPs in EPPO cross-border investigations, as well as with authorities of non-participating Member States and third countries.

Throughout their term in office mandate as European Delegated Prosecutors, they remain members of the prosecution service or judiciary of their Member State and are granted by their Member State the same powers as national prosecutors.

FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES

Duties and responsibilities	 To investigate, prosecute and bring to judgment perpetrators of, and accomplices to, criminal offences falling within the competence of the EPPO; To carry out acts of prosecution and exercise the functions of prosecutor in criminal proceedings in the competent courts of the Member States, until the case has been finally disposed of; To exercise the role of assisting European Delegated Prosecutor for measures assigned pursuant to Article 31 of the EPPO Regulation in regard of cross-border investigations; To cooperate with authorities from third countries and non-participating Member States in accordance with Articles 104 and 105 of the EPPO Regulation; To manage the material and human resources allocated to the EDPs at decentralised level:

	 To engage, develop and promote, in consultation with the respective EP(s) and upon delegation, the administrative and operational cooperation with competent national authorities; To be involved in the work of the central level (Permanent Chambers' meetings, working groups, sub-groups of committees or boards, workshops). To participate in trainings sessions organised by the EPPO or relevant partners.
Qualifications	Requirements for European Delegated Prosecutors in accordance with Article 17(2) of the EPPO Regulation
Education & Experience:	 To be active members of the public prosecution service or judiciary of the respective Member States which nominated them. To be independent beyond any doubt; To possess the necessary qualifications and relevant practical experience of their national legal system, in particular with investigations of crimes falling within the competence of the EPPO;
Knowledge of Languages/other abilities:	 To possess satisfactory knowledge of English, as the EPPO's working language in accordance with Decision 002/2020 of the College of the EPPO.
Specific responsibilities ³	European Delegated Prosecutors designated to substitute the European Prosecutor in accordance with Article 16(7) of the EPPO Regulation
	 To carry out the functions of the European Prosecutor in case he/she is unable to carry out his/her functions or left his/her position according to paragraphs 5 and 6 of Article 16 of the EPPO Regulation; Where applicable, to carry out other functions, such as coordinating and inter-institutional relations roles, as determined by the College in the decision designating the EDP to substitute the European Prosecutor.
