Subject: Complementary study supporting the review of the Workplace Directive 89/654/EEC and the Display Screen Equipment Directive 90/270/EEC

The European Commission is financing a complementary study to support the review of Council Directive 89/654/EEC concerning the minimum safety and health requirements for the workplace and Council Directive 90/270/EEC on the minimum safety and health requirements for work with display screen equipment. Policy options have been identified for a potential update of the two Directives. These policy options are based on a previous study carried out in 2022 and take into consideration the adopted opinions of the Advisory Committee on Safety and Health (ACSH) on the revision of the two Directives, among others.

The current complementary study involves the collection of information from key stakeholders across EU Member States through interviews and focus groups on the proposed policy options. Specifically, information sought during discussions relates to the assessment of impacts of the proposed policy options. The aim is to provide the European Commission with insights on costs and benefits related to a potential update of the Directives. Therefore, collecting stakeholder views is important to assess the impact of the policy options.

A consortium comprising Deloitte, Panteia, vhp Human Performance and Spark Legal and Policy Consulting has been appointed to carry out the complementary study.
