BACKGROUND





Since the start of Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine:

cultural heritage sites have been damaged, **35** completely destroyed (as of August 2025)

cultural institutions have been damaged,
481 completely destroyed (as of August 2025)

cultural institutions remain in the temporarily occupied territories

cultural institutions have been relocated 20% of specialists in the field have left the country

of workers in the field have lost their jobs or are not receiving salaries

lower salaries in culture than the average for the Ukrainian economy

of the population do not have access to cultural services due to their closeness to the front line or the lack of shelters in institutions

\$24.4 billion

- total losses of the cultural sector (RDNA4 estimate).

The CRA is an international platform initiated and coordinated by Ukraine. It brings together governments, international organizations, donor institutions, and civil society to support culture as a driver of resilience, recovery, and peacebuilding in the context of war and post-crisis reconstruction.

On 10 July 2025 in Rome, during the Ukraine Recovery Conference (URC2025), the establishment of the Culture Resilience Alliance (CRA) was officially announced. The corresponding Rome Manifesto was signed by Minister of Culture and Strategic Communications of Ukraine and Minister of Culture of the Italian Republic.


The Alliance is designed as a platform for consolidating efforts, not as a mechanism for financial contributions



- Supporting cultural and creative communities as agents of change.




ORGANIZATION AND COORDINATION
