The venue

The [Hotel Melia Serrano](#) is situated in a privileged location in Madrid's Salamanca district, situated next to the well-known Calle Serrano Street.

The hotel has many metro stations nearby. It is well connected with the city centre, which is a 10-minute metro ride away via Rubén Darío Metro Station, 200 metres away. It also has easy access to the A-2 and M-30 Motorway.

How to get to the venue

- From the airport Madrid-Barajas Adolfo Suárez Airport (MAD):

By Metro (Fastest and Cheapest Option)

Take Metro Line 8 from the airport (Aeropuerto T1-T2-T3 or Aeropuerto T4) to Nuevos Ministerios station.

Transfer to Metro Line 10 towards Puerta del Sur and get off at Gregorio Marañón station.

Walk about 10 minutes to the hotel.

 Duration: Around 30 minutes

 Cost: Approximately €5

By Taxi (Most Comfortable Option)

Official taxis are available at the airport terminals.

The flat rate from the airport to the city center is €30.

The journey takes around 20-25 minutes, depending on traffic.

By Bus (Alternative Option)

Take the Expres Aeropuerto Bus (yellow buses) from the airport to Cibeles.

From Cibeles, take Bus Line 1 (towards Cristo Rey) and get off at Rubén Darío.

Walk 5 minutes to the hotel.

 Duration: Around 40-50 minutes

 Cost: Around €6

- From the main train stations

- From **Atocha-Almudena Grandes Railway Station** to Meliá Madrid Serrano:

By Metro:

 Take Line 1 (Light Blue) towards Pinar de Chamartín and travel to Gran Vía station.

🚶 Transfer to Line 5 (Green) towards Casa de Campo and get off at Rubén Darío station.

🚶 From Rubén Darío, the hotel is about a 5-minute walk.

🚌 **By Bus:**

Go to the nearest bus stop and take 🚌 Bus Line 19 towards Plaza de Cataluña.

🚌 Get off at Serrano - Diego de León, which is just a few minutes' walk from the hotel.

- From **Chamartín-Clara Campoamor Railway Station** to Meliá Madrid Serrano:

🚇 **By Metro:**

🚶 Take Line 10 (Dark Blue) towards Puerta del Sur and travel to Gregorio Marañón station.

🚶 From Gregorio Marañón, the hotel is about a 5-minute walk.

🚌 **By Bus:**

Exit the station and take 🚌 Bus Line 14 towards Conde de Casal.

🚌 Get off at Serrano - María de Molina, which is close to the hotel.

Madrid is the capital and most populous city in Spain. It has almost 3,4 million inhabitants and it is one of the largest cities in the EU. Every year, this city welcomes millions of tourists who come here in search of an immense cultural offer, a mild temperature and an enviable gastronomy. Madrid is home to some of the most revered museums in the world, such as Prado Museum, with works by Goya and Velázquez, Reina Sofía Museum, with Picasso's Guernica and several works by Dali, and the Thyssen-Bornemisza Museum, where paintings by Van Gogh and Monet stand out.

Madrid Top 10

- Prado Museum
- Retiro Park, the biggest green area in the city
- Royal Palace and Almudena Cathedral, two impressive symbols of Madrid, where you can learn history about Spanish monarchies and contemplate a modern cathedral

- Thyssen-Bornemisza National Museum
- Puerta del Sol, one of the liveliest sites in the city centre
