Thank you for your email and your continued interest in Riigi Teataja.

The legislation published on the riigiteataja.ee website does not include prohibitions on reprinting and citing and you may indeed use the texts in your report. However, should it prove useful, we direct your attention to the possibility of supplementing the link with „/current“ at the end to redirect the user to the wording that is always the most up-to-date and currently in force. Should you wish to refer to provisions separately, you may use the links for that as well, see [FAQ point 7](#).

The name of our ministry has changed since we last exchanged emails and is now the Ministry of Justice and Digital Affairs. Copyright information does not need to be indicated separately. Additionally, as we do not have official translations – meaning that translations hold no legal power, even if translated by sworn translators, only the Estonian language versions do – we ask you to reword „Official Translation reproduced“ to just „Translation reproduced“ to avoid confusion on that front.

All in all, you are free to cite and reprint the translations of Riigi Teataja legal instruments in your report, as before. We wish you great success with the newest edition!
